Text type: Recount Reading level: 13 Word count: 234

Vocabulary: strawberries, plants, weed, dug, soil, scarecrow, holes, eaten, snail

pellets, netting

Possible literacy focus:

Writing in the first person.

Identifying words that indicate a text is written in the first person.

Summary:

This book is about how a boy grows some strawberries.

It describes the steps he takes to grow the plants, as well as what he does to

protect them from birds, snails and his pet duck.

Task card

Make a scarecrow

You will need:



material, sticks, wool, paper, felt-tip pens, icypole sticks, large sheet of brown paper, scissors, glue, sticky tape


- 1. Draw your scarecrow on the sheet of brown paper.
- 2. Glue material onto the paper for the clothes.
- 3. Glue wool onto the paper for the hair.
- 4. Draw the scarecrow's face.
- 5. Display your scarecrow in the classroom.

Cut out the pictures. Write about each picture. Make a mini book.


