Comparing seaside plants with plants in the school garden.

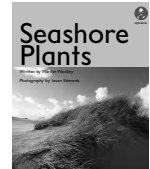
Summary:

Task card

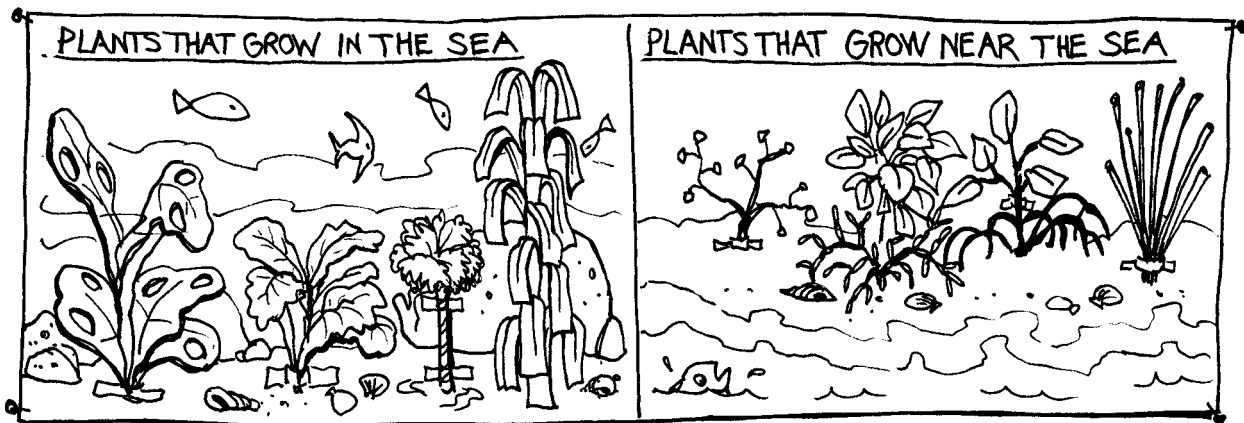
Seashore collage

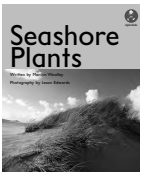
You will need:

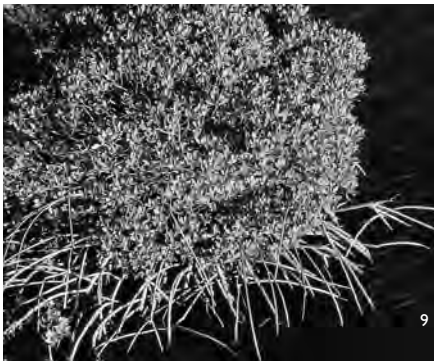

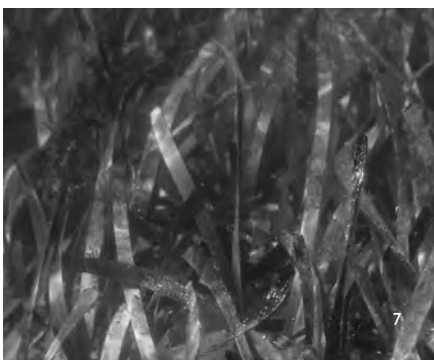

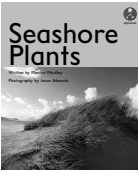
