

My Toys

Topic: Toys

Curriculum link: Society and Environment; Technology

Text type: Caption Reading level: 1 Word count: 25

High-frequency words: I, like, my

Vocabulary: blocks, truck, teddy bear, train, animals, toys

Possible literacy focus:

Using print concepts and pictures to support reading.

Follow-up activities

What toy is that?

Describe a toy to the children, giving a number of clues about what the toy looks like, what it is made of and how it works.

Ask the children to work out which toy you are describing, e.g. "The toy I am thinking of has four wheels. It moves if you push it along. You can put things in the back. It can be made out of plastic, metal or wood." (A truck)

Do this for several toys and then ask the children to play this guessing game in pairs, with children taking it in turns to give the clues and have guesses.

Grouping words

Write a list of toys with the children. Ask the children to categorise the words from the list by their first letter. For example:

You will need:












coat-hanger cardboard


- 3. Ask a friend to add a toy to one group.


