Topic: Animals around us **Curriculum link:** Living Things

Text type: Caption Reading level: 1 Word count: 25

High-frequency words: this, has

Vocabulary: zebra, snake, caterpillar, tiger, fish

Possible literacy focus:

Developing concepts about print: starting point, left-to-right movement

across the page.

Developing one-to-one word matching.

Follow-up activities

Stripes and camouflage

Introduce the word 'camouflage' to the children and discuss its meaning. For example, "When an animal looks like or is the same colour as its surroundings we say that it is camouflaged." Ask which of the animals in the book would use their stripes as camouflage.

Discuss:

Why would the animals that we saw in the book need camouflage?

Are there different reasons for being camouflaged? Apart from stripes what other ways can animals be camouflaged?

How would life be different if animals that are usually camouflaged couldn't be?

Finding out more

Provide the children with a range of factual texts or CDs on animals to look through. Ask the children to find pictures of animals with stripes. They can then draw the animal showing their colour and style of stripes.

Children could draw a habitat for the animal making it difficult for other animals to see it.

Sorting animals

Provide a range of plastic animals for the children to sort into groups: animals with stripes and animals without stripes.

Discuss with the children where each animal might live and how its stripes might help it to hide


- 1. Draw an animal with stripes.
